## b. Discussion:

- i. Student Educational Planner (Handout) The Registrar is encouraging advisors to promote student use of the Student Educational Planner (SEP). During the ALC discussion, deans were told SEP, Trial Schedule Builder and Degree Audit, are not synchronized. Nathan Hoff has created 200 SEP's, and would like Colleges to begin maintaining them (i.e. curricular changes). Per BAC, SEP have not been heavily used, and the value is suspect.
- ii. Enrollment Update and Projections: Summer & Fall
  - a) Admissions -15%, Confirmation Fees -2%, SOAR -10%, & Housing -5%
  - b) UG down, GR slightly up
  - c) First time college -10%
- iii. Career Center Standards Consultants Visit An Organization of Career Center professionals is providing an on-site peer review. When the team asked what MSU can do to help students get careers after graduation, support for internships were cited, yet the Career Center is planning to discontinue support for employer assessments. Kelly Rapp will join our next CLT meeting.
- iv. CHPA Course Proposal Business and Professional Ethics (driven in part by a course with a MOTR number in Core 42). CLT unanimously supported removal of "Business" from the course title due to concern it would be viewed as a COB course. This concern will be shared with CHPA Dean Matthews.
- v. COB Policy Manual 3.5 Workload Guidelines Revisited Discussed which sections of the original 3.5 Workload Policy needed to be retained with the new clarifying language regarding the process for faculty to receive, lose, and regain a reduced teaching load for SA status. Following support from CLT, the revised language will be reviewed by the Faculty Executive Committee (FEC) along with some other minor revisions to their proposed draft. The minor revisions that

were not supported included adding "submissions" to Category B, and allowing individual faculty to directly initiate an FEC policy/process review. CLT members agreed that requests should be routed through the Dean to ensure there is sufficient merit or support for a full FEC review. Revised language provides for COB committee members and chairs, as well as department heads to submit requests for policy/process reviews to the Dean.
