b. Discussion:

- i. Adding Users to a Blackboard Course Jeff Jones
 - We now have the ability to add TAs to course list. Guest option has been disabled. Rather than have each faculty member call the help desk – it was agreed to submit one list from each COB department and submit them early to avoid delays. Current role options are: Course Builder, TA, Instructor or Student.
- ii. Talent for Tomorrow (see handout) Initiative focus is workforce development COB is ahead of the curve as our majors are aligned with career opportunities. Funding is still in question.
- iii. Faculty Handbook Revision Provost will focus revising items of locus of tenure, graduate council membership, emeritus pay, job abandonment, sabbaticals, teaching loads, early pre-tenure reviews and limits on per course, etc. Our COB representative was Barry Wisdom who has retired. Dr. Rozell will identify candidates for his replacement on this committee.
- iv. Study Away Proposals DH Reviews (Proposal and Courses)
 - Proposals that come to Department Heads for approval must include written approval for all courses included from the respective department head/college prior to the proposal being sent to Elizabeth Strong. This topic will be added to the ALL COB meeting agenda for the FA18 meeting. Dr. Ragan will monitor rigor of courses and deliverables and determine eligibility for COB Study Away Award.
 - Currently presidential scholars do not get study away vouchers Dr. Ragan is working to get that changed. Incoming freshman get \$1,000 voucher.

 - a. Interdisciplinary Opportunities COBs proposed entrepreneurship model is a good example of interdisciplinary cooperation.
