b. Discussion:

- i. Spring Showcase Melissa sent an update email this week. Materials will be delivered to offices tomorrow. Stef, Juli, and Janet will be helping with check-ins. Will follow the same format as the fall. Self-guided tours with maps will be provided. Admissions representatives will be present to help families with any questions or issues they may have.
- ii. Summer Retreat

 - b) One day or mini-retreats The consensus is that if we meet in person then we can have a one-day retreat. If we meet virtually, then it is preferred to have mini retreats.
- iii. Mask Compliance Issues Reinforce to students that the mask policy is still in place. Remind people to wear their mask if they are not wearing them. If you have any issues with students, contact the Dean's office for assistance.
- iv. Guiding Principles for Blackboard The Deputy Provost has reported that select faculty are not using Bb. If you know of anyone not using Bb, please encourage them to use it as students are familiar with the platform. If Bb is not being used, faculty must demonstrate they have effective means for making online announcements, sharing feedback, and providing access to grade data.

 - b) Learner Centered Syllabi This would consist of changing the language from "don't dos" to "dos". There may be some workshops coming up to educate faculty.
